Children SHOULD be kept home from school for the following reasons:

- A child with a fever of 100 degrees or over needs to be kept home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone without the help of Tylenol or ibuprofen
- A child with vomiting and/or diarrhea needs to be kept home until the symptoms are gone. Remember to give the child plenty of fluids to avoid dehydration.
- Children with severe cold symptoms such as an extremely runny nose, sore throat or frequent cough should be kept home until they are feeling better. They can pass their cold germs to other children in class. If your child has a fever, sore throat and unable to swallow without discomfort, please have this checked by your child's doctor before coming to school. If strep throat is diagnosed, your child must be out of school for 24 hours after antibiotics have been started.
- Do not send your child to school with an unidentified rash. This should be checked by your child's doctor to make sure it is not contagious.
