3rd and 4th Grades will present "Carnival of the Animals" on Tuesday, May 22, at 6:30 pm.

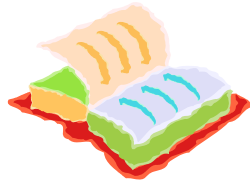
5th Grade will present the musical "The Patriots" on Thursday, May 24, at 7:00 pm.

THE NURSE'S CORNER by Maria Bouvier, RNCSNT

The weather is getting better and the children want to wear their summer like clothes and shoes. I would like to ask you to be sure that your child doesn't wear backless shoes. When they go out to play at recess there is a good chance they will get hurt. Thank you for your help.

Unfortunately, along with the nice weather there is a menace by the name of **ALLERGIES!** There are many myths about allergies and I would like to share with you.

The Myth: Only children can develop allergies.

Busted: Not true. Allergies can develop at any age.

The Myth: There are allergy-free furry animals.

Busted: No. Cats, dogs, horses, hamsters, and rabbits produce dander. It makes no difference if the animal has long hair, short hair or no hair. Dander is microscopic flakes of dead skin. This is what causes an allergic reaction. Safer pets may include fish.

The Myth: Moving to the desert will cure your allergies.

Busted: Although deserts lack ragweed and maple trees, there are other plants that produce pollen. You may become sensitive to these new pollens, causing your allergies to worsen.

The Myth: Hay fever is caused by hay.

Busted: Hay fever is not caused by hay, nor is it a fever. It's a term used to describe common allergic reactions like a stuffy, runny nose and sneezing.

The Myth: Allergies are just "in your head."

Busted: Technically yes, allergies can affect the head area (nose, throat, eyes, etc.). But they are most certainly real. An allergy is a medical condition that occurs when your immune system (your body's defense system) overreacts to a foreign substance.

The Myth: Allergies can be passed on to a friend.

Busted: Allergy symptoms are sometimes misread as a common cold. But assure your friends and co-workers that they cannot catch your allergies.

DRESS CODE

WOONSOCKET SCHOOL DEPARTMENT ELEMENTARY STUDENT/PARENT HANDBOOK

The following type of dress are not allowed:

1. Halter tops, bare-midriff blouses or micro-mini skirts.
2. Muscle shirts and tank tops.
3. Spandex shorts, short shorts or bikini shorts (shorts no higher than four inches above the knee are prohibited).
4. Headgear of any sort, including hats, headbands, bandannas, head phones/radios, etc.
5. Shirts with obscene, distracting or distasteful symbols or language.
6. Any garment or ornament determined or perceived by an administrator to be gang-related in nature.
7. Any footwear that can be considered a safety hazard to the student or student body.
